Opening ceremony		The FIPP Chair thanked the Chairman, the Secretary General and other represent-tatives of the SAI of Indonesia for hosting the 9 th FIPP meeting and for their hospitality and warm welcome. The FIPP Chair stressed that a special focus at this meeting will be on the development of the next SDP for the IFPP – and FIPP's task will be to balance the many inputs received from INTOSAI and other stakeholders with the strategic goal of INTOSAI to become a professional standard setter. The Chairman of the SAI of Indonesia underlined that SAI's ultimate purpose is to give value and benefits to the citizens, and that audit standards are key to ensure the quality processes of audits. FIPP is responsible for the quality of standards produced by INTOSAI and the SAI of Indonesia supports and appreciates FIPP's efforts.
