- 3. FIPP consider templates (ex project proposal documents) and drafting conventions
- 4. We need to get expertise in project management onboard (hire in from outside?) to look at output, definition, risks, communication, branding etc
- 5. A lot of willingness from the GCs to lead the initiatives/projects
- 6. No need to change due process. Project stages ref due process to involve FIPP when needed.

She proposed that the discussions and work in this agenda item would focus and elaborate on these bullet points in order for the SDP core-group to get a foundation for the further work and also to get a consensus of the roadmap within the FIPP-group.

It was agreed that the participants discussed and decided on inputs to the core group in the form of concept papers for each initiative. The form of the concept papers had the following headlines:

- Why this initiative is important
- Expected deliveries
- Link to other initiatives
- Competences needed
- Possible timeframe
- Possible amount of working hours that need to be committed

The aim of the concept paper should be as «sales document» to be used in order to get people on board the initiatives.

The draft concept papers will form the basis of the further work within the core-group and will be presented for a final decision/approval to the attendees of the SDP Roundtable at the next meeting (March/April 2024) before distributed to the INTOSAI community as a call for participants.

All drafts made at the FIPP meeting will be distributed to the participants after the meeting for information.

The different initiatives could be presented in different foras depending on the goal and content of the initiative but the aim should be to have a group of project leads for all five initiatives in order for coordination, planning and agile workstreams as well as to facilitate good communication, transparency and openness to secure that the best participants are made aware of the opportunities that are presented in the work of the different initiatives/projects as a way to develop the work of the INTOSAI community.

For further discussions on a later point when the concept papers have been developed are:

- For discussion: The need for FIPP involvement in the process – Both formal and informal steps
- For further explorement: Communication channels in all steps of the SDP process.

Points to be explored were: • Communication between FIPP and the project team • Consultation with other that the involved parties when in need • Project proposals should be updated • Drafting conventions need to be developed further • Roles and responsibilities Additional points regarding internal issues to be discussed could evolve around: • Roles and responsibilities • The LO role • Do we see the need for new competence in FIPP to support the initiatives? • Should we do more analysis ourselves to prepare for a particular project? As additional points regarding external issues: • Should we do more consultations? • What can be improved in our communication with the project team? • Are INTOSAI members familiar with our web page? • What communication issues do we want to raise with the NICO group? Due to timing and the prioritizing of the completion of the concept papers for the core group – see agenda item FIPP plan for 2024 and onwards, the discussion on the current agenda item will be postponed to a FIPP meeting in the first half of 2024.

Information from the PSC Chair	Information from the Governing Board 21 November 2023: New FAAS Chair and vice Chair: SAI UK/SAI Sweeden – The two SAIs will divide the responsibility of Chair/vice Chair with the SAI UK as Chair for the first two years and the SAI Sweden as Vice for then to switch responsibility for the remaining period. The ISSAI 140, ISSAI 100 updates and ISSAI 2000 updates was adopted by the Governing Board For the ISSAI 140 a number of amendments in other pronouncements were identified necessary to align with the updated 140 by the project group. The PSC will work closely with its Subcommittees in this regard also in connection to the work on the SDP initiatives/projects stemming from them and will report back to FIPP in this regard according to due process. The SDP 2023-2028 was finally endorsed by the Governing Board 2023. New FIPP members appointed by the three Goal Chairs (PSC, CBC and KSC) and finally approved by the Governing Board, the two new FIPP members from January 2024 are: Mr Tiago COSTA (SAI Brazil) Mr Jared NYASANI (SAI Kenya) A very warm welcome to them into the FIPP.
